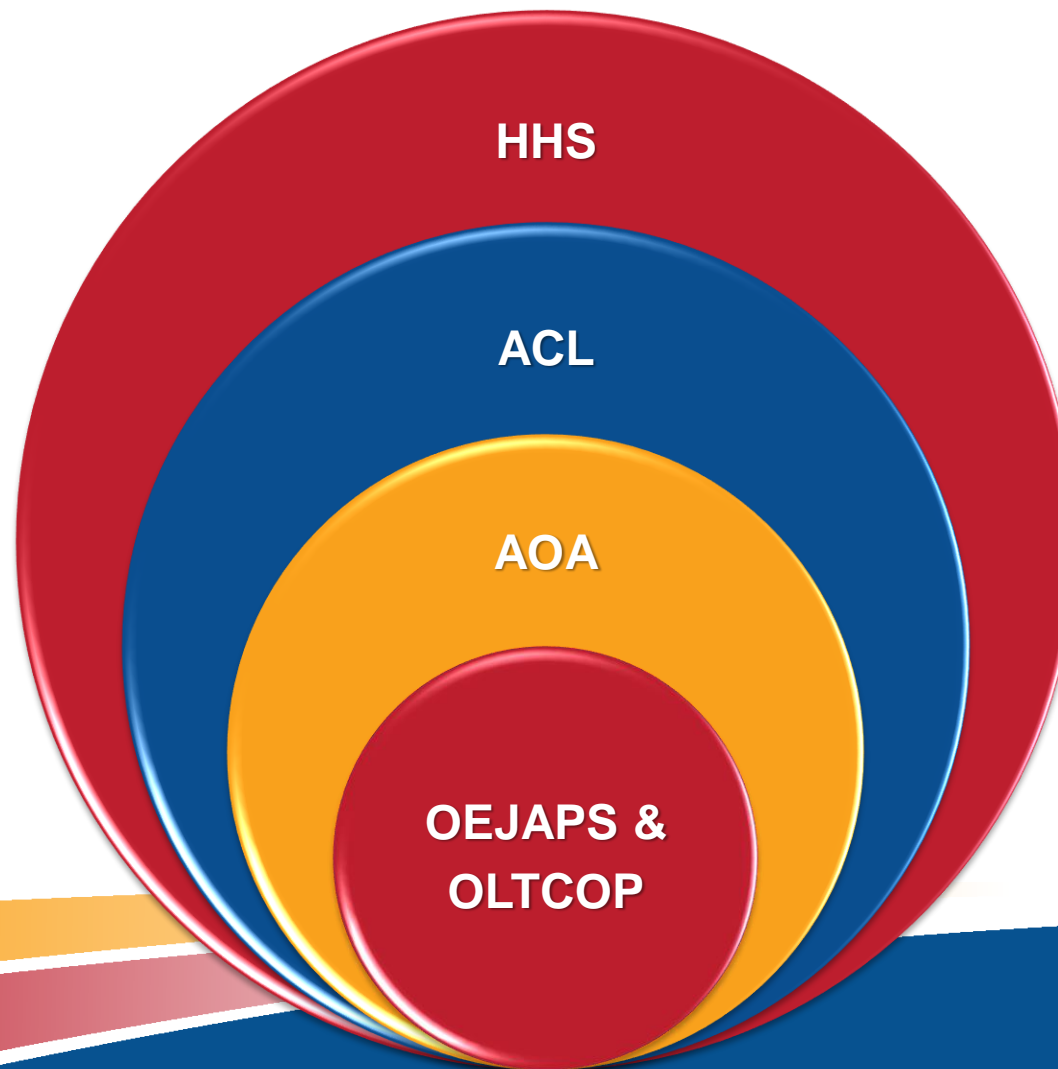

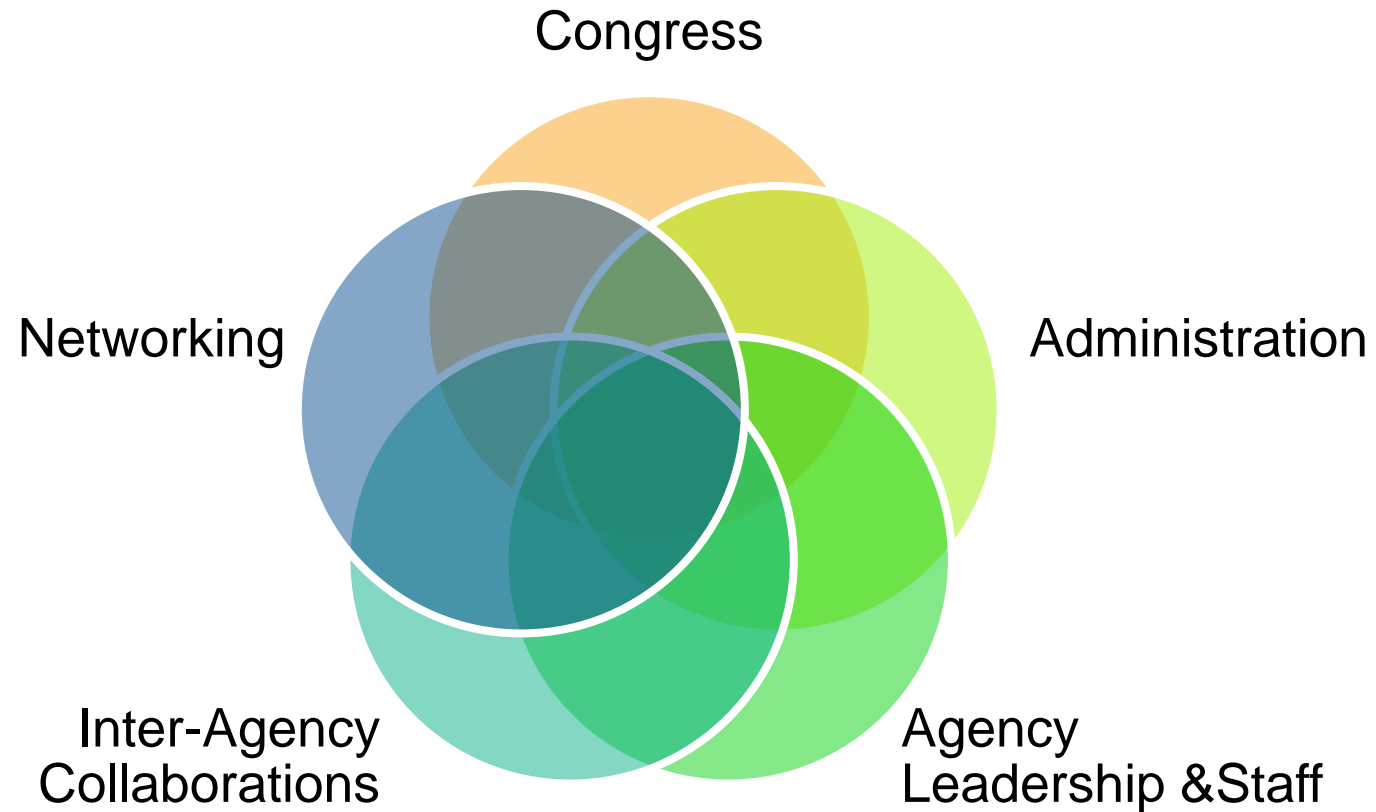

ACL's Vision for Elder Justice

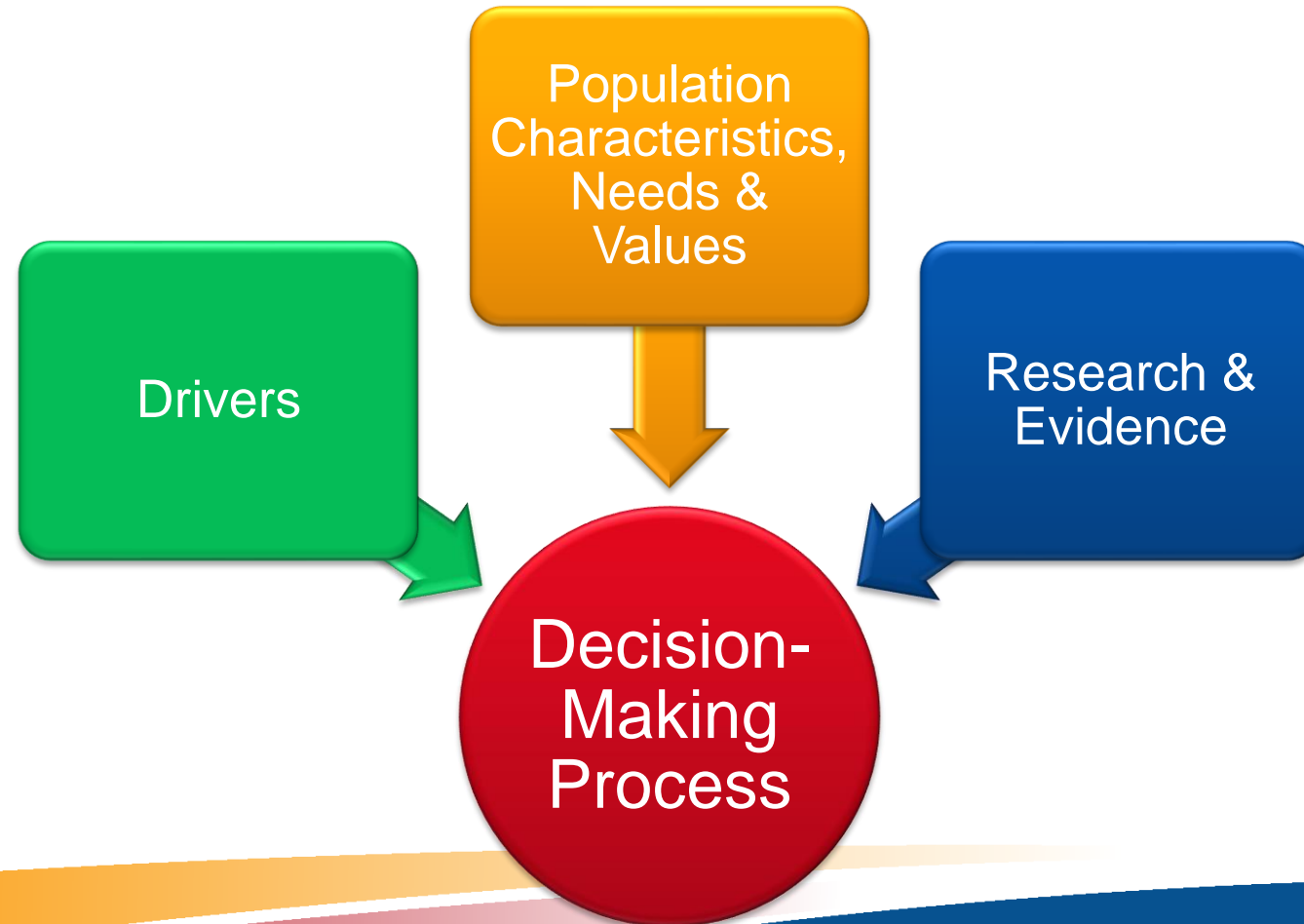
